

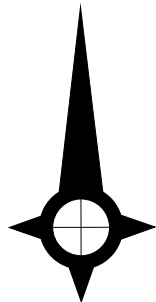
Cave A, Vlêrmuis Grot

This cave is a large, straight passage, and houses roosts of both insectivorous and fruit eating bats. The large chamber is filled with bat guano, and the stream flowing out of the cave is rich in invertebrate life.

Cave C

This cave is a complex network of passages, and has formed on many different levels. The eastern chamber sometimes houses a colony of insectivorous bats. The western, pool facing entrances are filled with drift wood and indicate that the pool water level varies by at least 3m.

Note: The position of the caves are accurate relative to one another, but the outline of the pool has been estimated.

Cave B

This cave has 2 distinct sections. The northern slot starts as a wide, high entrance, and narrows significantly towards the east. The upper chamber of the southern section is a large summer roost for insectivorous bats.
